



There is so much to see and do at our West Virginia Quilt Festival. I urge you to enter your work, take a class or two, see what our vendors have brought to tempt you, and to come and be inspired by the works of our members.

During judging, Doris not only looks for quilts which exhibit excellent workmanship and design, but also a personal reflection of the quiltmaker, which gives the quilt a unique or unexpected twist.

### Thursday's Class "Modern Piecing 101 and Straight-Line Quilting"



Diana Beverage is a native West Virginian, currently residing in Marlinton. She has been doing quilting and art work for 33 years, and is the proud owner of Artcents', a long arm quilting and art company. Diana started out as a traditional hand quilter, and has grown into an award-winning long arm quilter. As a matter of fact, her oldest grandson checks her trophy wall every time he visits, and asks, "Any new ribbons, Grandma?"

In the last several years, she has explored a variety of techniques, and has found her niche in art quilts. She is very proud of a pictorial quilt, "Just Walk Away," which was done using one of the techniques she will teach in this class. This piece is not only a blue -ribbon winner at several shows, but was purchased by the West Virginia Culture Center

in Charleston, for their permanent collection. The piece combines her love of quilting and painting in one special quilt. While traditional quilting is still the foundation of her work, she strives to work outside the box and add her own twist to develop something unique.



## Modern Piecing 101 and Straight-Line Quilting

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In this class you will have fun playing with solid colors and exploring improvisational modern piecing. Also you will be learning how to finish this project with straight line quilting. Diana will show you how to use your ruler foot and your walking foot for straight line quilting.

Cost of kit is \$15, payable to the teacher, and is not included in the cost of this all-day class. Kits include all fabrics for the top, backing, and batting. Background fabric choices are gray, black or white.



Or you can bring the following cut and ready for class. You will need:

Background fabric, gray, black or white:

1- 15" x 49" for backing, 1- 2 1/2" strip WOF, 1- 4 1/2 "x 18 1/2" strip, 1- 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip, 4- 2 1/2" x 14 1/2" strips,

1- 2 1/2" x 18 1/2" strip, 2- 2 1/2" X 12 1/2" strips and 4- 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips

Assorted solid colors for blocks:

 $3-2\frac{1}{2}$ " Strip WOF,  $4-5\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks and  $4-10\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks Batting piece, 15" x 49" Backing piece, 15" x 49"

You will also need thread to match your background fabric, threads in the primary colors or to match the colors you have picked, neutral colors like gray or tan for piecing, and an assortment of colors for quilting.

**Basic Sewing Supplies:** 

Sewing Machine in good working order Seam Ripper Scissors and Fabric Two bobbins pre-wound with thread Pins, if you use them in piecing Extension cord or surge protector Extra Needles Walking foot and/or ruler foot Rulers for cutting and straight line marking Marking tool, Frixion pen or Mark-B-Gone

Diana will be providing a few cutting and pressing stations. If you have a small pressing and/or cutting board you may want to bring them; same with lighting.

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### Friday's Class "Dimensional Thread Painting"



You don't want to miss this amazing hands-on class with Joyce Hughes! In this class you will start with a beautiful panel to create a piece of art. You will learn the proper steps of Dimensional Thread Painting and find it to be a fun and creative technique. Explore the various thread selections, setting up your machine for stitching techniques with free motion quilting or zigzag and straight stitching, bobbin work and embellishing with netting and crystals. See the fabric come to life as you sew and layer the threads on top of your design. You will use thread as paint and sew with different types of threads and color combinations. Learn how to add interesting texture and dimension to your quilting project. You will leave with a full knowledge of Dimensional Thread Painting and create a one of kind piece of art!

### Dimensional Thread Painting Orange Zinnia/Swallowtail Butterfly Panel

<u>Techniques Taught</u>: Free Motion Quilting, Dimensional Thread Painting, Overlay Application, Crystal Embellishment, Bobbin Work and More!

## <u>Friday 6:30 pm - Joyce Hughes, Dinner Speaker</u> Journey into Quilting and Dimensional Thread Painting



Joyce Hughes is a self-taught quilter and fiber artist. Her first quilt was a tee-shirt quilt, which she enjoyed making, but felt limited in the ability to express her artistic capabilities. Within several months, she began to design pictorial landscape quilts using raw-edge appliqué, thread painting, and a variety of embellishments. She never knew "the rules", so she broke a lot of them, but with exciting results.

Amazingly, her first art quilt, "Mother's Day," was entered into competition, and won a blue ribbon. This has led to numerous awards, recognition, and opportunities in the quilting world. On October 23, 2012, she was selected as McCall's Quilt Designer 2012-Professional Category, for McCall's Quilting Magazine. The contest winners were featured in the May-June 2013 issue.

Her love and passion for quilting has allowed her to design handbags, art bags, and art quilts. She has found these very challenging and rewarding. Each piece has allowed her to try a variety of new and different techniques with added dimension and texture. She continues to create and design one-of-a-kind quilts and handbags that have personal meaning with a touch of whimsy that captures the heart and imagination.

## **Entering Your Quilt In This Year's Festival**

First, Is your guilt made by one person from beginning to finish, two people, or three or more? Pick the appropriate category... Individual, Duet or Group.

The remaining categories are Non-Judged; they are Clothing/Accessories/Home Décor, Youth, and Display Only.

Second, Is your guilt Pieced, Appliqued or a Mix of techniques? This should narrow your choices to two or three possibilities.

Third, Measure the outside or the **perimeter** of your guilt and check the box that fits your quilt.

**Finally...Sleeves**– All guilts must have a 4-inch hanging sleeve securely attached to the back of your guilt. This sleeve should measure 86 inches from the bottom of the quilt to the top of the sleeve. See the Festival Entry Instructions for more information or visit our website... www.wvauilters.org.


WVQI membership runs from January 1 to December 31. Membership renewal notices are sent out in early December.

### **Quilt Documentation Project**

The 2022 Festival will again provide plenty of opportunity to document your family heirlooms or quilts in your collection. It only takes about ½ - 1 hour to document a quilt so you can come for the day – document your quilts and still have time to view the show, take a class and enjoy other activities and vendors. All information collected will be stored in the state archives and will be uploaded to The Quilt Index. Information about quilt ownership will remain confidential. And, if you enjoy getting up close and personal to some pretty special quilts and stories, volunteer to help.

The response of owners bringing in quilts has been heartwarming. Family stories are told and preserved. Loved ones and their quilts are being remembered in a special way. Stories and images are being shared with family by viewing the Quilt Index site.

### West Virginia Quilt Documentation Project

The Quilt Festival will provide a convenient opportunity to bring quilts made in 1970 or earlier for documentation. Make an appointment (limit of 2 quilts) and a team of volunteers will measure, photograph, date and ID the pattern. Bring information and pictures of the maker, but "maker unknown" quilts are also welcomed. Data gathered will be stored in the WV Culture Center Archives and will be uploaded to The Quilt Index.

Quilts (limit of 2) will be documented by appointment. Walk-ins will be accepted only if scheduling allows.

## <u>Log Cabin Exhibit</u>

### "Log Cabin Quilts" Exhibit by Amy Pabst



Amy lives in rural West Virginia, literally at the intersection of a dirt road and a "holler." Her quilting career began in 2011 when she randomly picked up a book about quilting from the local library. Since then, she has made over 200 quilts, many of them wall quilts and miniatures. She is active in several guilds from local to international, and has been a professional quilt judge since 2014. In 2019, she was certified by the National Association of Certified Quilt

Judges. Her quilts, including several from this Log Cabin series, have won many awards at national and international competitions, and pictures of her quilts have been featured in Quilt Scene, Quiltmania, American Quilter, and Quilter's Quarterly.

The Log Cabin block is one of the oldest and most recognizable American quilt patterns. This series focuses on miniature scale (block sizes range from 3/4" to 4") and explores the unlimited layout and design options of this simple, yet versatile block. The blocks are constructed of either 1/8" or 1/4" strips, and so each quilt is made up of many, many small pieces. Altogether, there are 102,779 individual pieces in this collection. Except for the first two quilts, the series was made over a period of 2.5 years, and the series was considered complete when a total of 100,000 pieces was reached.

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The designs, layouts, and fabric choices for these quilts are either inspired by the original designs of contemporary quilters, inspired by antique quilts dating pre-1900, or totally original.

## The Friday Night Challenge


As part of the 2019 West Virginia Quilt Festival, those who bought tickets to the Friday night dinner were issued a challenge. Inspired by that year's Special Exhibit, "Quiltmaking That Saw Us Through World War II," by Sue Reich, a Gold Star mother from Connecticut, interested diners were charged with the task of creating a small quilt to fulfill the theme: The Greatest Generation.

Volunteers chose one of thirty colored sacks, each of which included a fat quarter of reproduction 30's fabric. They were to add plain muslin, and at least one solid. They were free to add other fabrics, preferably from their own stash of "carefully-hoarded scraps." Quilts were to evoke the time period of World War II and The Greatest Generation, whether it was a pieced pattern of that era, or an appliqué quilt with images of those years.

Only those who bought a ticket to the 2019 Friday Night Dinner are eligible to participate in this challenge. The winners will be determined by popular vote of those who attend the dinner in 2022 at the West Virginia Quilt Festival. The winner will receive a \$150.00 gift certificate to The Quilt Shoppe, on Main Street in Summersville. The runner-up will receive a certificate for \$75.00, also to the Quilt Shoppe.

Challengers, this is your call to draw from the memories and photographs of your families, from movies and books, or from the internet to look for ideas from that time; to search within yourself for the strength, creativity, and resourcefulness of The Greatest Generation. Let's show everyone what you came up with!





### **RULES FOR THE FRIDAY NIGHT CHALLENGE**

- Your quilt may be hand or machine-sewn. It must consist of 3 layers: a top, a batting, and a backing, and must be fastened together by quilting.
- QUILTS MUST BE TOTALLY THE PRODUCT OF JUST ONE PERSON. You make the top, you quilt it.
- Quilts must measure at least 8" X 10" and no larger than 24" X 24."
- Attach a label on the back with your name and the title of the quilt.
- You may keep your quilt or donate it to the Little Quilt Auction.
- Inside each sack, you'll find a fat quarter of a 30's reproduction fabric. You must use this fabric in your quilt.
- You're to add plain muslin and at least one solid. You are encouraged to use scraps from your own stash.

Mail your quilt to Joni Hoffman, 225 Black Birch Path, Duck WV 25063 to arrive between June 6-10, 2022 or you may deliver to Joni at the Arena by no later than 4pm on Thursday, June 16, 2022.

Good luck to our 30 challengers! Be sure to buy a ticket to this year's Friday Night Dinner to vote for your piece, and to have a chance at next year's challenge.

#### Class: "Modern Piecing 101 and Straight-Line Quilting" with Diana Beverage Thursday, June 16, 9:00 am-5:00 pm (lunch break 12:00-2:00 pm)

\*\$65 (\$55 WV Quilters, Inc. members)

Will cover design and construction, including quilting techniques.

Cost of kit is \$15, payable to the teacher, and is not included in the cost of this all-day class. Kits include all fabrics for the top, backing, and batting. Background fabric choices are gray, black or white.

### Class: "Dimensional Thread Painting" with Joyce Hughes

This full-day class will cover thread painting techniques, with hands-on sewing to create a Butterfly and Zinnia block.
